month of December leading up to Christmas Day. The Advent candles readily demonstrate the strong contrast between darkness and light. In the Bible, Christ is referred to as the "Light of the World" contrasted with the darkness of sin.

Human history spanned long ages before our prophesied Savior would finally make his appearance, and God's promise to make all things new through him.

As his Advent, or "coming," draws nearer another candle is lit, with each candle dispelling the darkness a little more. Thus, the Advent wreath helps us to spiritually contemplate the great drama of salvation history that surrounds the birth of God Incarnate who comes to redeem the human race.

Traditionally, each of the four Advent candles have a deeper meaning which is depicted in the lovely Four Weeks of the Advent Wreath:

The Third Sunday of Advent is Gaudete

Sunday and is meant to remind us of the joy that the world experienced at the birth of Jesus, as well as the joy that the faithful have reached the midpoint of Advent. This Sunday we light the "Shepherd's Candle" symbolizing Joy.

The 4th Sunday of Advent symbolizes Love With the "Angel's Candle" reminding us of the message of the angels: "Peace on Earth, Good Will Toward Men."
