Gospel: Jn 2:1-11

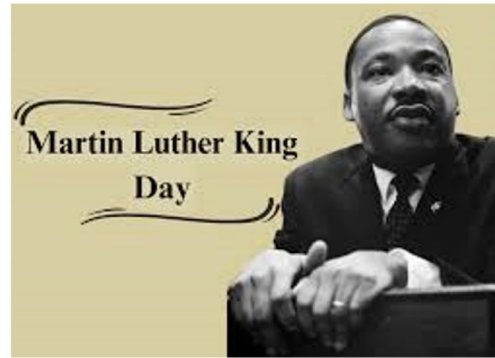
